01 / START HERE

GOOD RIDES START HERE.

A guide for the grown-ups behind the adventure. Get to know the bike, check the rider's fit and keep its care record together in one place.

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ABOUT THIS EDITION

Includes reconfirmed dimensions and photo-verified components. Fuel, control procedures, assembly and service settings still need exact-bike documentation. Not a complete operating manual.

02 / BEFORE THE ADVENTURE

THE RIDER COMES FIRST.

A petrol dirt bike needs preparation, suitable protective equipment and responsible adult supervision.

01 Choose the rider, then the bike.

The supplier recommends riders over 4 years old. Age alone does not establish suitability. Consider height, reach, ability and experience, as well as the bike's size and power.

02 Get equipped.

Wear a properly fitted motorcycle helmet, eye protection, gloves, boots that cover the ankles, long sleeves and long trousers. Plan for adult supervision whenever a child rides.

03 Choose the right place.

Use a suitable off-road area where riding is permitted. Keep speed appropriate to the terrain and rider. Arrange hands-on instruction for a new rider.

READ BEFORE RIDING

This is a motorised vehicle, not a toy. Review the controls and stopping method with the rider before any engine start. See the manufacturer-confirmation notice on page 8.

03 / GET TO KNOW THE BIKE

MEET YOUR KIDMOTO.

04 / SIZE & FIT

SMALL BIKE. KNOW THE FIT.

Measurements confirmed by the supplier for this bike.

Check these measurements against the rider's reach and fit. The 80 kg maximum load is a weight limit, not a guarantee of fit. Illustration not to scale.

Top speed varies with rider and conditions; it is not a recommended riding speed. Dimensions are on page 5.

DW4901 is the source booklet reference. Exact model / engine identity, tank capacity and bike weight are still unverified. Photo checks describe the supplied bike configuration.

06 / PREPARE THE BIKE

CHECK BEFORE YOU GO.

Assembly must be completed and checked before the bike is used. The supplied manual mentions aligning the handlebar and securing the handlebar fasteners, the parts described as the front board and footboard.

ASSEMBLY DETAILS REQUIRED

The source does not give a complete fitting sequence or tightening torques. Ask the manufacturer for the exact procedure and a competent person to check the finished assembly.

ADULT PRE-RIDE CHECK

- ☐ **Rider** - Fit, protective equipment and supervision.
- ☐ **Controls** - Identify throttle, brakes and engine stop control.
- ☐ **Bike** - Check for damage, loose parts or fuel leakage.
- ☐ **Tyres & brakes** - Use the manufacturer's inspection procedure and specified settings.
- ☐ **Riding area** - A suitable permitted off-road area for this rider.

This preparation list does not replace the missing model-specific inspection and assembly instructions.

07 / ENGINE & CONTROLS

BEFORE THE FIRST START.

DO NOT FUEL OR START FROM THIS EDITION

A precise fuel mixture and a complete control / starting / stopping procedure have not been verified. Obtain the corrected manufacturer instructions first.

01**Measure the fuel mixture.**

This two-stroke engine requires petrol and two-stroke oil. The exact ratio and oil grade remain unverified. Measure oil in millilitres once specified; capfuls and another bike's ratio are unsuitable.

02**Know the separate controls.**

A fuel tap controls fuel flow; a choke helps cold starting; an engine-stop control stops ignition. Their fitted positions and operation must be identified on this bike before a starting sequence is issued.

PETROL SAFETY

An adult should handle fuel. Keep petrol away from children and ignition sources. Stop the engine and let it cool before refuelling outdoors, away from buildings. Dismount before filling the tank.

Never run the engine indoors or in an enclosed space. Exhaust contains poisonous carbon monoxide.

General fuel and exhaust precautions: HSE guidance. These do not provide the engine's mixing or starting instructions.

08 / LOOK AFTER THE RIDE

RIDE. REST. CHECK.

01 Keep the ride controlled.

Use smooth, controlled throttle and braking. Sit centrally with a balanced posture. Ride slowly on rough, loose or slippery surfaces; avoid sudden acceleration or braking.

02 Park on level ground.

Look for people and vehicles around you. Bring the bike to a controlled stop on a level surface. Use the manufacturer-confirmed engine-stop procedure and make sure the bike is stable before leaving it.

03 Let the engine cool.

Stop the engine and allow it to cool before refuelling. The source's 30-minute cooling advice remains unexplained; research has not established an operating limit for this engine.

04 Record the care it receives.

Use the maintenance record on page 11. Follow the confirmed service schedule and settings once supplied. Report damage or a fault before further use; do not guess an adjustment.

HOT PARTS / MOVING PARTS

Avoid contact with a hot engine or exhaust. Keep hands and clothing clear of the chain and wheels. Confirm the manufacturer's inspection and service precautions before working on the bike.
